This study is my answer on this topic!

The term **Trinity** is not used in the Bible therefore will not be used in this study, and shouldn't be used in our conversations on this doctrine. This is not biblical language.

The first recorded use of the word "Trinity" in Christian theology that I could find was by *Theophilus of Antioch* around 180 C.E. He used the Greek term "Trias" meaning "a set of three" or "the number three" to describe God, his Word, and his Wisdom. This term therefore, is outside the canon of scripture, and should not be used for this reason. It is a made up word.

The term **Godhead** however, is used three times in the new testament in the KJV. There may be more, but these are the verses I found,

Acts 17:29 KJV

Forasmuch then as we are the offspring of God, we ought not to think that the **Godhead** is like unto gold, or silver, or stone, graven by art and man's device.

Romans 1:20 KJV

For the invisible things of him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even his eternal power and **Godhead**; so that they are without excuse.

Colossians 2:9 KJV For in him dwelleth all the fulness of the **Godhead** bodily.

The Greek word translated Godhead is theiotēs | θεός which means divinity, divine nature, God. Used also in the Bible to refer to pagan gods, see Acts 14.11 for example. So the context is obviously important.

The Greek root of this word speaks to the **nature of God**, which is what we want to explore in this study. The English translation of this Greek word, Godhead, comes from the Middle English godhede, or **godhood**. Implying a covering, or encapsulation of the head, or containment for divinity. And also certainly implying a mystery or a concealment of sorts. And that there is more than one.

John Wycliffe introduced the term *godhede* into English Bible versions in two places, and, though somewhat archaic, the term survives in modern English because of its use in three places of the Tyndale New Testament (1525), the Geneva Bible (1560/1599), and King James Version (1611). In that translation, the word was used to translate three different Koine Greek words:^[3]

The King James Version of the Bible, which is the only divinely inspired English translation, use of this word, makes it clear that God is not just singular, monotheism, but there is more to the nature of God, as we will see throughout the study. But it's first

important to humble ourselves and realize the fact that,

The more we search the Bible, the deeper is our conviction that it is the word of the living God, and human reason bows before the majesty of divine revelation. 31Education, 170.

Christ will lead the redeemed ones beside the river of life, and will open to them that which while on this earth they could not understand. 32SDA Bible Commentary 5:1124.

Acts of the Apostles, 51-52 My 1970 version

is plainly declared regarding the Flory Spirit that, in this work of guiding men into all truth, "He shall not speak of Himself." John 15:26; 16:13.

The nature of the Holy Spirit is a mystery. Men cannot explain it, because the Lord has not revealed it to them. Men having fanciful views may bring together passages of Scripture and put a human construction on them, but the acceptance of these views will not strengthen the church. Regarding such mysteries, which are too deep for human understanding, silence is golden.

The office of the Holy Spirit is distinctly specified in the words of Christ: "When He is come, He will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment." John

44 [51-52]

The **nature** of a person is everything that they are.. their identity, character, history, personality, talents, etc. *Everything* about them, their very essence, as the definition of the word shows.

However, being incomprehensible doesn't mean being unintelligible. Or unknowable, at least as far as we need to understand for salvation this side of heaven. God reveals Himself to us in the Bible as far as we need to know.

The Bible does provide a fundamental

explanation, or paints a picture of what God is like. His nature and even composition. And it is indeed deep and complex! As it should be.

If you could sum up God in one word what would it be?

1 John 4:16 KJV

And we have known and believed the love that God hath to us. **God is love;** and he that dwelleth in love dwelleth in God, and God in him.

I contend true love is more than just a concept or a theology. Love is expressed, it's shown, it's demonstrated. And it is known, if we know God. Not only known but experienced.. "dwelleth"

Here's some biblical ways God's love is made known to us,

Selfless love demonstrated in community, in family. In this thought is the **Godhead.** God has always, from eternity past to eternity future, lived and existed in community.

THE GODHEAD EXISTS IN UNITY

The biblical Godhead can be defined as separate and distinct divine Beings perfectly united in love, purpose and family. One God in the sense of unity, not literally.

Ellen White describes this same unity in believers, within the Church. We are created in God's image (Gen 1.27) which includes the capacity for divine unity, love and commitment to ea other,

Ministry of Healing, 422

"The unity that exists between Christ and His disciples does not destroy the personality of either. In mind, in purpose, in character, they are one, but

not in person. By partaking of the Spirit of God, conforming to the law of God, man becomes a partaker of the divine nature. Christ brings His disciples into a living union with Himself and with the Father. Through the working of the Holy Spirit upon the human mind, man is made complete in Christ Jesus. Unity with Christ establishes a bond of unity with one another. This unity is the most convincing proof to the world of the majesty and virtue of Christ, and of His power to take away sin."

In the same way, the members of the **Godhead** exist in this divine unity.

John 10:30 KJV I and my Father are one.

John 16:14 KJV
He (the Holy Spirit) shall glorify me

IS THIS TAUGHT IN THE BIBLE?

That's the only question that matters

1 John 5:7 KJV

For there are **three** that bear record in heaven, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost: **and these three are one.**

One God

Deuteronomy 6:4 KJV Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God is **one** LORD.

Hebrew "Lord": **Yah·weh** = proper name for God the Father.

Hebrew "God": e·lo·hei·nu = divinity, divine nature, God. The equivalent word in *Greek* for theiotēs means divinity, divine nature, God = translated "Godhead" in the KJV.

Ephesians 4:4-7 KJV

There is **one** body, and **one** Spirit, even as ye are called in **one** hope of your calling; **one** Lord, **one** faith, **one** baptism, **one** God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all. But unto every **one** of us is given grace according to the measure of the gift of Christ.

There are dozens of verses in the Bible that specifically says there is but **one God,** or that God is one. Google it, check it out. So how do we reconcile these two ideas.. one God or multiple divine individuals in the Godhead?

It's all about Unity!

2 Corinthians 13:14 KJV
The grace of the **Lord Jesus Christ,** and the love of **God,** and the communion of the **Holy Ghost,** be with you all. Amen.

Here is part of the mystery: How can there be 3 yet 1? Or for that matter, how could there be 2 yet 1? The Bible clearly says God is One. It's a mystery! Like how can Jesus be 100% God and 100% man at the same time? How can the Son be the literal Son, but be from eternity? Proverbs 8.23, 12TMs 101. We don't really know, but we take the Word of God in faith. Consider Ellen White's counsel.

Well said. Even though we can't fully comprehend God, we are to study the Bible and grasp His nature as best as we can, without offering speculation, or our opinion, or judgment on those who see it differently.

When I study it honestly, I see the Bible being clear there are indeed **three at work.** All 3 are shown in the Bible working together. Most Christians agree there is 3, the Bible is clear on that. The question is.. Is the **Holy Ghost** a divine person, or only the spirit of the Father or Son? We will see what the Bible says!

Again, the **Godhead** is not one God literally in composition, but one only in the sense of **unity.** Working together. Ellen White calls the Father and Son, associates or co-workers,

PATRIARCHS AND PROPHETS

The history of the great conflict between good and evil, from the time it first began in heaven to the final overthrow of rebellion and the total eradication of sin, is also a demonstration of God's unchanging love.

The Sovereign of the universe was not alone in His work of beneficence. He had an associate—a co-worker who could appreciate His purposes, and could share His joy in giving happiness to created beings. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God." John 1:1, 2. Christ, the Word, the only begotten of God, was one with the eternal Father—one in nature, in character, in purpose—the only being that could enter into all the counsels and purposes of God. "His name shall be called Wonderful, Counselor, The mighty

Just because we only see the Father and Son here, doesn't mean the Holy Ghost isn't a part of the Godhead. **We have to consider the whole of scripture.** This will be a constant theme in this study.

THE GODHEAD IN THE BIBLE

The Greek for the word name is **onoma**, meaning "name, character, fame, reputation" Therefore, each has a character. Therefore each is a person.

Some scholars say this verse shouldn't be in the Bible, but this is simply not true. **Ellen White** backs up the validity of this important verse here, and in

hundreds of places in her writings,

"Clothed with boundless authority, He gave His commission to the disciples: "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations," "baptizing them into the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit: teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I commanded you: and lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world." Matthew 28:19, 20, R. V. Desire of Ages, page 819

Why would God's prophet include a verse that's not supposed to be in the Bible hundreds of times?

But just because the **Holy Ghost** is left out in places, doesn't mean there's only two. There are plenty of verses only speaking of the Son, does that mean there's not a Father?

John 16:14 KJV

He shall glorify me: for he shall receive of mine, and shall shew it unto you.

Holy Spirit + the Son. No Father seen here, does He not exist?

We must consider the whole of scripture for our theology.

ONE IN PURPOSE

SEPARATE RESPONSIBILITIES

1 Peter 1:1-2 KJV

All throughout Scripture, God the Father is described as the overseer of all, the source of everything, the source of life,



This is the first use in the Bible of the **Father's** proper name. Here it is in the Greek,

Matthew 11:25 KJV

At that time Jesus answered and said, I thank thee, O Father, Lord (Greek, Kurios) of heaven and earth, because thou hast hid these things from the wise and prudent, and hast revealed them unto babes.

God the Son

Is described in the Bible as our creator, our sacrifice, Saviour, advocate, friend, brother, judge, returning king. He came in the flesh not only to die and pay for our sins, but also to reveal the Godhead's true nature of unselfish love. God with us. Jesus Christ is, and has always been the **literal** Son of God the Father. This is *not* a metaphor,

Isaiah 12:2 KJV
Behold, God is my salvation; I will trust, and not be afraid: for the LORD

JEHOVAH is my strength and my song; he also is become my salvation.

(YESHUA)

Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

[22] The LORD **possessed me** in the beginning of his way, Before his works of old. [23] I was set up from **everlasting**, from the beginning, <u>Or</u> ever the earth was.

God the Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is God made real and personal in our lives. He is God actually living inside of us. Our teacher, guide, convictor (conscience), comforter, our

power, conviction. He is the actuator. He gets things done on behalf of the three!

It's true, He is not called "God the Holy Spirit" in the Bible, but neither is the Son. No one prays to the HS but no one prays to the Son either. But for both, plenty of verses show their divine natures as we will discuss in this study.

Not many deny the Father and Son, but the Holy Spirit is an enigma. Some see Him as an *impersonal force* or *influence* from God, others deny His very existence (modalist) and others are not certain who or what the Holy Spirit is.

However, the Bible is very clear on this matter; the Holy Spirit is a **Person**, the Third Person of the Godhead. Ellen White clearly states this fact in the *Desire of Ages*, page 671. And agrees in this 1899 statement speaking of the

opening of Avondale College in Australia,

"We have been brought together as a school, and we need to realize that the Holy Spirit, who is as much a person as God is a person, is walking through these grounds, that the Lord God is our keeper, and helper. He hears every word we utter and knows every thought of the mind." Manuscript Releases, 66, 1899

Notice she makes a *clear distinction* between the Holy Spirit and God the Father.



Plus dozens of other published statements made later in her life. Some are towards the end of this study for your consideration.

To state that a **person** isn't really a person but is the spirit of *another* person, does not make sense, and would make the Word of God confusing and misleading.

THE REASONS I BELIEVE IN THE BIBLICAL GODHEAD

The **Holy Spirit** is presented in the Bible as a real, tangible, separate individual. Just like the Father and Son are.

It's as simple as that. Yes, He is described as a force or a spirit in places, as we will discuss, but He is more than

that as presented in the Bible.

He is a Person.

From my close examination of numerous Bible texts, if God is simply describing a mirroring, reflective force or spirit that is in actuality Himself or His Son, then the Bible is terribly misleading. Why would God present the Godhead as three when it's not? I just don't see God leading people intentionally into confusion like this on something this important. Have a hard time seeing God as Babylon! Making the Holy Ghost appear in scripture to be a divine individual, when He is not? That is misleading and confusing to me.

And why would God even use the term Godhead? Why not just say "the only true God and his Son"? Or similar. The term Godhead itself implies something beyond only Father-Son.

Some would say to this point, "narrow is the road and only a few find it" or we have to dig for truth like a hidden treasure, or wrestle with God like Jacob to get to the truth. Or you're "not spiritual enough" to get it, "you need spiritual eyes". All perhaps true in the right context, but on this topic God would certainly make it plain and clear. But yet it appears to me to be debatable from the Bible. There are legit points on both sides, but I feel the weight of evidence is clearly on the side of 3 not 2

So if you study it for yourself and come to different conclusions than others, just know that these arguments are the height of **gaslighting**. Don't fall for such tactics, this is not of God.

So to me, the logical conclusion is that the Holy Spirit is just as presented! A divine Person. **Occam's Razor** is true,

and it states that "the simplest answer is usually the right answer". And it doesn't matter at all if the majority believes it or not, Truth is truth. Follow the truth regardless!

Complicated and mysterious isn't always good. Conspiracy theories aren't always right just because few believe them. Gnosticism was all about complicated and secret knowledge that only a few knew. None of this was of God. The plain reading of scripture is simple and best.

THE HOLY GHOST IS A PERSON

The **Holy Ghost** is presented as a separate Person throughout Scripture,

John 16:13-14 KJV Howbeit when **he**, the Spirit of truth, is come, **he** will guide you into all truth: for **he** shall not speak of **himself**; but whatsoever **he** shall hear, that shall **he** speak: and **he** will shew you things to come. **He** shall glorify me: for **he** shall receive of mine, and shall shew it unto you.

- The HS is literally described here by Jesus as a separate being.. Comforter vs I (Jesus)
- Jesus defines the HS's role with us.. Comforter.
- He convicts of sin, only God can do this, therefore Divine
- Again, why would Jesus present the Comforter as someone separate if it's really Himself?

Here is how this verse might read in the RNTV. Of course it doesn't, therein lies the problem,

John 16:7-8 RNTV

Nevertheless I tell you the truth; It is expedient for you that I go away: for if I go not away, I, the Comforter, will not come unto you; but if I depart, I will send my Spirit unto you.

Why would the Bible seek to confuse us intentionally? It doesn't! That's why there's 3 not 2 in the Godhead.

BIBLICAL INTERCESSION FORGIVENESS IS A PROCESS

And involves **all three of the Godhead.**To use a human example, it's like a relay race.

The **Holy Spirit** convicts us of sin in partnership and cooperation with the **Father and Son.** They all work together.. repentance, to mediation, to forgiveness.. for the salvation of



But also numerous times He is referred to as "**The** Holy Ghost" and "he" or "him" which is a *personal pronoun*, implying a separate person doing the action.

This is a **fence post** that needs to be straightened, because there is way more biblical evidence that He is a Divine separate Being, instead of just a force or spirit of the other two.

Instead of these phrases leading to confusion or contradiction, it's best to understand the references of "Spirit of Christ or of God" or the "omnipresence of Christ" (EGW) to simply show their intimately connected natures and working together. The Father or the Son indeed "sends" the Holy Ghost to do the work of redemption on behalf of them all. "Of" is a preposition, and means "expressing the relationship between a part and a whole". This is exactly the description of the Godhead.. three (the

parts) expressing the relationship of the whole, the Godhead. All with the same objective and on behalf of them all. The Holy Ghost is a representative Person by nature, so He represents both, on behalf of them all (John 15.26). That I believe is what the inspired writers of the Bible had in mind. Therefore the doctrine of the three perfectly united in the Godhead has its origins in the Bible. Not the Catholic Church as implied by some seeking only to spin the narrative.

INTIMATELY CONNECTED STILL SEPARATE

This **intimate connection** between the 3 is biblical and can be clearly seen in this verse, Jesus speaking,

John 14:10 KJV
Believest thou not that I am in the
Father, and the Father in me? the words
that I speak unto you I speak not of
myself: but the Father that dwelleth in
me, he doeth the works.

Almost like they are **one**, but yet they are separate and distinct, just like the Holy Spirit.

Not literally "in" Jesus, except through the indwelling Holy Spirit (Luke 4.1) because the Father and Son are separate and distinct divine Persons, just like the Spirit. But they are intimately connected to each other through perfect love, purpose and unity.

Here are some examples from the Gospels of this unity and cooperation, yet still separate,

Read John 15:26, The Holy Spirit speaks for the Son and is sent by the Father.

Plus, see her other statements towards the end of the century, particularly in The Ministry of Healing and Review articles and Manuscript Releases. God unfolded truth to His prophet over time. God has His timing! This is why it was integrated so late in SDA history. The Godhead doctrine was published officially in 1931-1932, and advanced

from there.

The concept of "Advancing Truth" or "Advancing Light" is something Ellen White wrote much on, particularly towards the last part of her life. And it's also a biblical concept.

This truth easily explains why God advanced our understanding of this doctrine over time. The doctrine wasn't "deceptively inserted" into our theology later in the church's history (as conspiracy theories suggest) rather was gradually revealed to the remnant church and Godly men over time by the Holy Spirit, beginning with God's own prophet in the Desire of Ages in 1898.

The truth moved forward from there.

Consider her quotes on the subject of new light,

"We cannot hold that a position once taken, an idea once advocated, is not, under any circumstances, to be relinquished. There is but One Who is infallible -- He Who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life." (Testimonies to Ministers and Gospel Workers, p. 105, par. 2).

"When God's people are at ease, and satisfied with their present enlightenment, we may be sure that He will not favour them. It is His will that they should be ever moving forward, to receive the increased and ever increasing light that is shining for them." (5T pp. 708, 709).

"We have many lessons to learn, and many, many to unlearn. God and heaven alone are infallible. Those who think that they will never have to give up a cherished view, never have occasion to change an opinion, will be disappointed." (RH: July 26, 1892).

Chapter 4—Attitude to New Light

Maintaining Truth Not to Preclude New Light—It is a fact that we have the truth, and we must hold with tenacity to the positions that cannot be shaken; but we must not look with suspicion upon any new light which God may send, and say, Really, we cannot see that we need any more light than the old truth which we have hitherto received, and in which we are settled. While we hold to this position, the testimony of the True Witness applies to our cases its rebuke, "And knowest not that thou art wretched, and miserable, and poor, and blind, and naked." Those who feel rich and increased with goods and in need of nothing, are in a condition of blindness as to their true condition before God, and they know it not.—The Review and Herald, August 7, 1894. {CW 33.1}

The catholic understanding is convoluted and **confusing** if you read all of it. *Babylon means confusion*. Here's an example from their explanation,

In one sense, the Trinity is easy to explain: Christians believe that there is only one God, but they also believe that the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God (Acts 5:1-4). God exists as three persons, but he is not three gods. He is instead one God who exists as three equally divine, equally eternal persons, and this truth forms the central foundation and mystery of the Christian faith (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* 234).
